

In the last of but one the clause for Reshipping ^{to} is very unreasonable
my Lord giving up his whole Revenue in consideration of the duty he
expects without Reward for if his Lordship should agree to the clause and
a War should happen and a ^{small} fleet taken his Lordship with his five
brother and sisters may want a support for that year, which doubtless
your Honour would think hard.

A clause obliging the Clerk of the Provincial Court and the several Clerks of
the Respective Counties to transmit yearly to his Lordship's agent for the
time being a fair list of all alienations recorded in any of their offices
and that in office and under a certain penalty.

This is what is occurred to me upon the cursory reading of the Rough
Draft of the Law and desire your Hon^{rs} will let me have the perusal
thereof when it shall be fairly copied.

Whereupon mee of the Committee proceed to view and inspect in what
condition the several offices aforesaid are in for the safe keeping the
Records upon which inspection wee find all the public offices well
fix'd for the safe keeping the Records except the Chanery and Land
offices (that is to say) the Chanery office wants one Desk table and two
Gourmes and Pigeon holes in the same manner, as the other offices are
fix'd, and the Land office wants more Desks in order to receive
the several records that are to be Joyned to the said office, and
further for the safe keeping the Records the severall windows of the
said State House ought to be well mended they being now much
