Aug: 9<sup>th</sup> 1716.  
May it please your Ex<sup>ty</sup>,  
The last Ships bound hence for England are speedily to  
sail by which the Lords Prop<sup>r</sup> will in reason expect remittance to be  
made to him of his last years revenue (viz<sup>t</sup> the 2<sup>d</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> 1/2<sup>d</sup> deducting  
thereout 1000<sup>l</sup> for your Ex<sup>ty</sup>'s salary. This I showed you in my instructions  
which (I doubt not) you knew before from Mr. Bradley, therefore desire
