viz that Instead of (his Majesty's Subjects) in y<sup>e</sup> title there be y<sup>e</sup> (Words)  
the Inhabitants).

Signed for the Mr. Be and Cl. 11<sup>th</sup> House.

Which bill was read the third time with y<sup>e</sup> Amendments by Special  
Order and pass for engrossing and sent up to y<sup>e</sup> Committee of Laws, &  
Col. Maehall to be engrossed.

The House adjourns till one a clock in the afternoon.
