or 1000 <sup>£</sup> 100<sup>s</sup> and 500 <sup>£</sup> 100<sup>s</sup> or 400 <sup>£</sup> 100<sup>s</sup> in y<sup>e</sup> Counties.

Resolved 1000 <sup>£</sup> 100<sup>s</sup> in Annapolis and 500 <sup>£</sup> 100<sup>s</sup> in y<sup>e</sup> Counties by the  
Majority of votes. The Question was put whether the Clerk of the County  
Courts shall receive 60 & 40 <sup>£</sup> 100<sup>s</sup> for their fees or but 30 and 20 <sup>£</sup> 100<sup>s</sup> on  
Ordinaries Licences.

Resolved that the Clerks shall have but 30 and 20 <sup>£</sup> 100<sup>s</sup> for  
their fees — Which Bill was read with the amendment and then  
endorsed vizt. By the Lower House of Assembly June 6<sup>th</sup> 1717.

Read the second time with the amendments and will pass.
