May it please your Honor

We find by the act made the 26<sup>th</sup> day of April 1715. that the 18<sup>th</sup> p<sup>th</sup> was raised to the right honorable Benedict Leonard Lord Baltimore in Lieu and stead of the 12<sup>th</sup> p<sup>th</sup> raised to the late Charles Lord Baltimore in Consideration of his taking his Quiet Rents and alienation fines in Tobaccos at 2<sup>d</sup> p<sup>th</sup> and was to be paid to the several Navall Officers by the Master of every Ship or Vessel &c. that the several Navall Officers on account of the 18<sup>th</sup> p<sup>th</sup> were obliged to render an account of and pay the same to the publick Treasurers of this Province to be by the Treasurers accounted for and paid to the right honorable Bred: Leonard Lord Baltimore in case he should be favourably pleased to accept the same in Consideration of his receiving his Quiet Rents and alienation fines in Tobaccos at 2<sup>d</sup> Sterling p<sup>th</sup> pounds after such acceptance.
