Thus we have faithfully and impartially considered what your Excellency had been pleased to lay before us and think ourselves obliged to return our humble thanks for the assurance you give us of your steady resolution to support ye Magistrates in the discharge of the trust reposed in them as much as in your lies and that you will not slacken your Endeavours to establish the protestant Interest in Maryland the Consequences whereof cannot be redound to your prejudice.
