out of the three pence p<sup>th</sup> for arms &c<sup>e</sup> with which we desire  
Your Excellencies and Honours concurrence.

Ordered that Charles Canoll Esq. the late agent for the Lord  
Baltimore attend this House immediately to give w<sup>th</sup> information  
he is Capable of whether the Lord Benedict late deced or his Ex<sup>cy</sup>  
ever signified their acceptance of the twelve pence p<sup>th</sup> which  
was continued by an Act made in June 1715 till the 29<sup>th</sup> day of  
September following and was to be paid to the said Lord Benedict
