Pursuant to your Message of the 4<sup>th</sup> instant  
relating to the continuance of the payment of the 12<sup>th</sup> p<sup>th</sup> by the act  
made in June 1715 till the 29<sup>th</sup> of September following - we did  
Yesterday send for Mr. Charles Canoll late agent for the Propriets  
of this Province at the time of the making that act who accordingly  
appeared before this House and being demanded to give an account  
of the Disposition of <sup>his</sup> duty and whether the Lord Benedict or his  
ever accepted or verified their intentions to accept thereof on the  
consideration it was raised he promised to send his answer thereto  
in writing this day and thereupon sent us the annexed Articles  
whereby your Honours may perceive how far that 12<sup>th</sup> p<sup>th</sup>  
has been accepted & how applied -

As to Mr. Canoll's intimating the rents being attacht in Money  
it was thing unattard from him for we are well assured that  
the person for whose use those rents were attacht never designed  
any thing but what was honorable as may appear by publick Letters  
to the severall Sheriffs for that purpose - and believe none of the  
persons whose rents were attacht will sustain any damage on
