The petition of the Inhabitants of St. Mary's County complaining of an undue Election of Mr. Thomas Wauglop a Member returned for St. Mary's County was read referred to the Committee of Elections and Privileges to examine the allegations therein mentioned and to make their Report thereof to the House.

The petition of Thomas Lintheim praying to be relieved against the false Making out his Patent only for six hundred and thirty one acres instead of eleven hundred and thirty one acres, was read and referred to the Committee of Aggravances to make their Report to the House and to call evidence before them - and Mr. M. Tuckrot and Mr. Robert Hanson added to the Committee on that occasion.
