They return and say they delivered it - Bill Explaining the Repealing Law was sent to the Upper House by Mr. Prousbey, Maj. Emerson, Capt. Colgate and Mr. Eade

They return and say they delivered it - The House adjourns till to Morrow Morning Eight a Clock

Tuesday May the 26th 1719

The House meet according to adjournment

Yesterday's proceedings are read - Bill for Relief of John Clements was read and ordered to be read in Dutch

By the Lower House of Assembly May 25th 1719

Read the second time and the Question being put whether the bill shall pass or not - Resolved in the Affirmative by the Majority of votes - Thereupon this bill will pass

And sent to the Upper House by Mr. Hill and Mr. Eade

They return and say they delivered it -

Capt. Mariatte from the Committee of Aggrievances delivers Mr. Speaker the petition of severall Inhabitants of this Province praying to be allowed to pay their Levys in Money which was thus Endorsed

By the Committee of Aggrievances May 25th 1719

Read and referred by the Committee of Aggrievances to the House for their Consideration thereon

Signed for order Phil. Hammond Esq. Com.

Which was likewise read in this House and referred till next Sessions of Assembly

On reading and considering that part of his Exceps Speech and the act relating to Jurors the Question was put whether a Supplement shall be added to that act or not

Resolved in the affirmative by the Majority of votes, and that the Jurors shall not receive any more nor the Suitors give more then one hundred and twenty pounds of Tobacco or twelve Shillings

Then the Question was put whether the County Jurors shall have more (than the one hundred and twenty pounds Tobacco usually taken) for their attendance or not

Carried in the affirmative of the Majority of votes

Then the Question was put whether they shall be allowed fifteen or twenty pounds of Tobacco of Drink

Resolved it be but fifteen pounds of Tobacco to be paid by the County
