By the Upper House of Assembly May the 27th 1719.
Gent^l On a second reading the bill for the better supporting the Magistrates in the administration of Justice within this Province this House proposes the following amendments to be made at the several marks therein vizt

1. Ministeriall officers or other persons
2. Suspending such practitioners of the law from their practice perpetually or for a time or to punish such practitioners or Ministeriall officers or other persons
3. Not exceeding four thousand pounds of Tob^o in the Superior Courts nor two thousand pounds of Tob^o in the severall County Courts within this Province on each offender for any one offence

With which if your House concurs y^e bill will pass

On reading the petition of Mr. Joseph Hill and hearing the allegations as well of the said Hill as of Thomas Bordley Esq and Thomas Larkin Gent^l The Question was put whether leave shall be given to bring in a bill as prayed or not
