Supplementary bill to the act for causing Grands and Petit Jurors and Trespasses to come to the Provincials and County Courts, and ascertaining their allowances, read and ordered to be thus Endorsed -

May 29<sup>th</sup> 1719 - Read and assented to by the Lower House of Assembly and - Signed by Order Mr. Jenifer Clk. Lo. Ho.

Supplementary Engros Bill to the act for the appointing of Constables and what relates to their office and ascertaining what persons are Taxables, was read and ordered to be thus Endorsed, vizt -

May 30<sup>th</sup> 1719 - Read and assented to by the Lower House of Assembly and Signed Ordered - Mr. Jenifer Clk. Lo. Ho.
