May it please your Honours, In answer to your Message by Esq. Brooke on Saturday last this House are of opinion that the act for causing Grand and petty Jurors and Witnesses to come to the Provincial and County Courts &c. Lays such a penalty on the Sheriffs to oblige them to return the best and most understanding free Holders in their County to serve for Jurors as we don't find one Instance where the Sheriffs have been fined for Default therein — That the Statutes of England sufficiently provide against Maintenance and Embarras besides the penalty in that bill, that only Magistrates, Delegates, Coroners, Schoolmasters, Overseers of Highways and Constables dueing their Continuance in their respective Stations or Businesses are exempt from attendance as Jurors by that act. Wherefore this House humbly desires that bill may be assented to by your House as it now stands.
