

Col: Addison from the Upper House delivers Mr. Speaker
The Bill removing an Act for the encouragement of Tillage and Relief of poor
Debtors thus Endors'd viz:

By the Upper House of Assembly June the 1st 1719
This house looking upon the Amendments proposed to be necessary
or a debate thereon - Resolved - that bill will not pass without
the amendments aforesaid,

And acquaints Mr. Speaker, that the Upper House has assented to
the Supplementary bill insert to the act for appointment of Justices
The question was put whether an addition of 2000 Tobacco shall
be made by the publick, to the Rector of St. Ann's Parish over and
above the usuall allowances in Consideration of his great Charge
in residing at the Seat of Government for the Service of the publick,

Carried in the affirmative by the Majority of votes

Thereupon Resolved that the Rev. Mr. James Shippon or the Rector
of St. Ann's Parish that shall be at the time of the laying of the publick
Levy be allowed his proportion of the said 2000 Tobacco for this year
for the time he shall stay in the said Parish

the following Message viz:

By the Upper House of Assembly June 1st 1719

Gent - On reading your Message of this day with the act relating
to Grand and Petit Jurors by Mr. Rowley and Col: Hynson we find
that your house on an Examination into the Secretaries office might
have seen Instances of Sheriffs being fined for not returning sufficient
Jurors, Particularly at a Provinciall Court held the tenth day of
September 1714 & Hall van Buekeloo High Sheriff of Cecil County, Mr.
Stables High Sheriff of Baltimore County and Mr. Wright High Sheriff
of Queen Ann's County were fined 50^l of Tobacco each for their defect
in that particular as appears by the records of that Courts proceedings
wherefore we desire your house will take into your further consideration
our Message of Saturday last by Esq. Brooke
