By the Commissioners appointed to Survey and layout the City of Annapolis &c^o (May) the 22^o 1719

Pursuant to the Directions of a Clause in an act of assembly of this Province, Entituled an act for the settling all disputes Concerning the boundaires of the severall Lots within the City of Annapolis and Confirming the same to the respective takers up, Improvers and purchasers thereof and for laying out ten acres of land out of the Town pasture into twenty Lots more to be added to the said City Empowering and Authorizing us to Enquire if any thing be due, and if any thing what is due from the publick for any part of the Lands laid out in the City aforesaid for the use of the publick.

We doe hereby Certify that on Tuesday the tenth day of March Anno: Domini: 1718. we called before us Mr. Lancelot Todd being former Proprietor of the Land within the City aforesaid.

Who being first sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty Gods! Declared that he cannot remember that he received any other sums on account of his being former Proprietor of the Land within the City of Annapolis than what is here under mentioned,

off Mr. Rich^d. Beale for 1 Lot, Mr. Henry Matthews for 1 ditto, Mr. John Beale for 1 ditto 0^o 10^o 0^o - Mr. J^r. Fresham for 1 ditto 0^o 10^o 0^o Mr. Thomas Bordley for 2 or 3 at 0^o 10^o 0^o each, Doct. Thomas Major for 1 or 2 ditto @ 0^o 10^o 0^o each, Mr. Tho^s. Holmes for 1 ditto - 0^o 10^o 0^o

And further the said Todd declares upon his oath that he has never received any Satisfaction for the publick grounds within the City of Annapolis - but that about the year he was informed by Mr. M^r. Taylor that he was ordered 1300 and odd pounds of Tob^o on the Sherr^o of Somersett County which Tobacco he never received nor knew any further thereof.

And further the said Lancelot Todd Declares that he verily believes he never received any Satisfaction from Col^o. Nicholson or Col^o. Dorsey for any Lots by them held in the said City but remembers that Col^o. Dorsey refused when Demanded.

All which in compliyance with the directions of the Clause in the act of assembly aforesaid is humbly Reported to the Lower house of assembly -
