the Grand Father of the petitioners for a Claim of 25000^l £. was
read and referred till next Sessions, and ordered that Joseph
Vansweingen or others Concerned have notice of the petition that
if they think fitt they may appear next Sessions and answer the
same and leave given to Subpoena witnesses.

Col: Ephraim Augustine Harman a member returned to serve
for Beavill County to the last assembly but being then hindered thro
sickness from attending appears now in the house.

Thereupon ordered that Mr. Dore and Mr. Lane more go to the
upper house to see him Qualified according to Law.
