By the Upper House of Assembly April 20<sup>th</sup> 1720  
His Excellency and this House think proper to Communicate  
to you their proceedings, relating to the Papists for your Conuenance  
which are Extracted from our Journals as follows

By His Excellency the Governour with the Conuenance of  
the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly now sitting, April 15<sup>th</sup> 1720

Resolved that Whereas the Papists have given out in  
speeches that they have a right to some priviledges which they do  
not now enjoy, they or such of them as shall think fitt do appear  
before His Excellency in the Upper House of Assembly at the Council  
Chamber by Saturday the fiseenth Instant or any other convenient  
time they desire during this session to make appear what priviledges  
of theirs are infringed the present administration of Government  
both Houses having Conuenced with His Excellency and promised  
to do them all the Justice that their Case requires but that their  
failure herein will be taken as a relation of their pretentions -

of which Resolve severall Copyes are made and sent  
to severall Sheriffs - in order to be delivered to the said Pminent  
Papists Viz: - Charles Caroll, James Caroll, Henry  
Dannall, William Digg, John Digg, Benjamin Hall,  
Clement Hall, Henry Dannall Jun: William Fitz Redmond  
Henry Wharton, Charles Digg, Peter Atwood a Priest -  
Maj: Nicholas Sewell - and Mr: Richard Bennette
