In answer to the observations  
 Your Honours have been pleased to make on that part of our  
 answer to your Message of the 9<sup>th</sup> instant — wherein we observed  
 we should be wanting in duty to his Lordship as well as be  
 drawn into measures prejudicial to the interest of the Government  
 who may hereafter preside over us — our meaning as to that part  
 was no other than — whereas the three former Gov<sup>r</sup>s hath been for  
 a considerable time given to the Government who have presided  
 over us, and since to our present Gov<sup>r</sup> during his Government —  
 in and over this Province, the Gentleman that succeeds may  
 (perhaps) very justly move us to letten the same allowance on him  
 which by the measures proposed will be out of our power to comply
