In answer to the Observations
Your Honours have been pleased to make on that part of our
answer to your Message of the 9th Instant - wherein we observed
wee should be wanting in duty to his Lordship as well as be
drawn into Measures prejudicial to the Interest of the Governour
who may hereafter preside over us - our meaning as to that part
was no other than - whereas the three pence p^{er} Ann^o: hath been for
a considerable time given to the Governours who have presided
over us, and since to our present Governour - during his Government
in and over this Province, the Gentleman that succeeds may
(perhaps) very justly move us to lessen the same allowance on him
which by the Measures proposed will be out of our power to comply
