Viz. - By the Upper House of Assembly October 15th 1720. - Read the first time and ordered to be read again on Monday morning. Signed by Order John Beale Clk. U. H.

The following message is prepared Viz. - may it please your Honours, by the Lower House of Assembly October 17, 1720; on considering the third Article of the Governours Instructions Communicated to us and in answer to your message, of the fourteenth Instant, by Coll. Young, and Coll. Addison and to demonstrate as well our Readiness to embrace this favourable Opportunity offered by their Lordships for the propagation of Learning as to show our respect to the Honour the Governour, and the great hopes and Expectations we have of his Honours good Government we have Resolved that the sum of three half pence per lb. be raised on all Tobacco, Exported out of this Province to be applyed to the use of Free schools to be erected in the several Counties within this province in the same manner as the twenty Shillings current money per pole or Negroes, is applyed and have also Resolved that the sum of three half pence may be raised for the use of his Honour, the Governour if he shall be pleased to accept thereof to continue till the twenty ninth day of September next

With which if your Honour concurs, a Bill may be prepared accordingly
