By the Upper House of Assembly October 19 1720. Gentlemen
We favour with your Message by fall Blackall with three
others of your House, in the time your purpose for the continuance of
actions in the Court of Law, but recommend that regard, as well
to actions already commenced, as those that may be hereafter com-
menced. For that several Actions now depending will be Discon-
tinued or Judgment given therein as the nature of the Case requires by
virtue of the act as it now stands unless relief be provided by the Bill
now proposed to be brought in, Signed by Order John Beale Esq;

With which this House (concurring) Ordered that the Committee of Law
prepare the Bill - The House adjourned till to morrow (morning) next of
the 20th of October 1720. The House met
