 Read and assented to by the Lower House of Assembly. And signed  
 per Order Mr. Jennings M. Lower House - And was sent to the  
 Upper House by Mr. Caldwell and Mr. Bailes who return and  
 say they have delivered it them - Thomas Boddy Esq. from the  
 Upper House, Delivers Mr. Speaker the Supplementary Bill to the Act  
 for Limitation of Actions Endorsed thus Viz. By the Upper House  
 of Assembly October 22<sup>nd</sup> 1720. This Bill being read does not  
 answer its End for the first Act being that they shall continue no  
 longer than a time Express'd which is shorter. And this Bill  
 being that they shall continue no longer than a time which is  
 longer can only Enlarge the time by Implication which can  
 never operate against the Express word of the former Law

We have therefore proposed the Bill herewith sent you with  
 proviso added. which we think very necessary for the right understand-  
 ing of the former Law. And also an enlargement of five months  
 time to the Chancery Court where there is the same necessity or  
 rather greater than in the Courts of Law. And where there are  
 Suits depending that lay under the same Case as in the Supreme  
 Court. Signed per Order. John Beale Clerk of the Upper House -  
 the Bill herewith sent was read and past for Engrossing and  
 was sent to the Committee of Laws. to be Engrossed, a Supplemen-  
 tary Act for the relief of Thomas. No answer was read the first and  
 second times by special Order and will pass which being so Endorsed  
 was sent to the Upper House, by Mr. Mackall and Mr. Smith who  
 return and say they have delivered it John Hall Esq. of the Ward
