

Settlement — Upon reading the within Bill we find that  
there is not any provision made to supply the want of any  
jurisdiction made choice of upon the first view who shall happen to  
die, before the bounds of the Law in dispute are determined, nor  
to supply the want, of any Jurisdiction of the Court of review who  
shall happen to be interested in the lands in dispute or related  
to any that are interested therein neither are the said Juris-  
-diction empowered to award Execution for the Costs or Damages,  
by them adjudged, nor to command the attendance of the Surveyors  
or other Officers, as in the former Law nor to return Writs or Cer-  
-tificates of their determinations to be entered upon the Records —  
therefore we recommend to your the drawing of a new Bill which  
may supply the several Defects before mentioned

Signer of Order for Peate (L. Up House)

The Representation of the Governour, Peator and Visitors of the Free  
Schools is read and referred till Monday next, Thomas Borden  
Esq from the Upper House delivers Mr Speaker the Bills for  
vesting in Edward Smith part of a Lot of Ground lying in  
Annapolis thus Endorsed Viz — By the Upper House of  
Assembly October 22. 1720. — This Bill being read, will pass  
with the following Amendments Viz that in stead of the  
words marked in the Bill (to wit) [Granted by this house to] these  
words be (inserted by an Act of Assembly on) and that the pro-  
-prietors purchase be paid in proportion Signed for the  
Peate (L. Upper House) — Whereupon the same Bill with  
the Amendments was read and passed for Engrossing the  
House adjourned till Monday morning Nine o'clock

Monday Morning Oct 24. 1720 The House meets according  
to adjournment Saturdays proceedings are read. An Motion  
of James Loyd, he has leave to go home. and so has Thomas  
Edmondson on the like motion Ordered that Thomas Borden  
and Ams Garret Esq. agree with workmen and find materials  
necessary for furnishing the room over the new back building  
to make it fit for receiving the Publick Library. And — Ordered  
that the Committee of Accounts allow to the Peate Governour  
and Visitors of the Free Schools, the sum of Eighty six Pounds  
thirteen Shillings and four pence current money for the Rent of the  
School house upon their Representation aforesaid to this house. and  
Engross Supplementary Bill to the act for Limiting the Continuance  
of Actions is read and ordered to be thus Enacted. (Viz Oct 24. 1720)  
Read and assented to by the Lower House of Assembly and Signed  
for Order (Mr Jenifer (L. L. House) and was sent to the Upper  
House
