 On the Petition of Richard Thatchers against Matthew Wallace
 and hearing the parties on both sides his order that the said
 Richard Thatchers be restored to his full quiet and peaceable
 possession of in and into the said wharf he was lately dispossessed
 by the said Matthew Wallace, or his Deeds by Virtue of a writ of
 possession issued from the East, Provincial Court and that the
 Sheriff of Cecil County do make restitution accordingly and
 also orders that all persons concerned in the dispute of the
 said Land, repair themselves for a more full and ample hearing
 at the next Session and that the parties wait further the
 Determination thereof

 here to this parliamentary order will (too believe) suffice him
 at present till we can be further informed of his case, a
 duplicate of which Order to be signed by the Clerks of both

Signet Order: John Neale of the Upper House
 with which all which this House concerns, Resolved that the
 Hon^{ble} Thomas Rordley Esq; and Lewis Jarrot, Esq; be appointed
 to inspect the said and Secretarys Offices, and agree with such
 persons, as they shall think fit for the securing the Records from
 any bad weather which may happen this Winter and to make
 their Report thereon to the next Assembly and orders that the
 following Message, be prepared Viz By the Lower House of
 Assembly, October 27th 1720 May it please your hon^{rs}, we agree
 with your honours that the Records ought to be secured from the weather
 and therefore have appointed Thomas Rordley Esq; of your House
 and Lewis Jarrot, Esq; of our House (if they think fit to undertake
 also the same) to inspect the said and Secretarys Offices and to
 agree with workmen to make the necessary Reparations in order
 to secure the records from any Damage they may sustain by means
 of the weather: who are to make their Report thereon to the next
 Assembly But as to the Repairing the Records, we desire the
 further consideration of them may be referred till the next Session
 unless the Gentlemen appointed by the Law will proceed further
 herein according to the directions of the said Signet Order
 Mr. Jefferies of the Governor's House, and sent to the Upper House by
 Col^l Wynson and Cap. Jones, who returns (and say they have delivered
 to Mr. Phillimon Lloyd Esq; from the Upper House. Delivered
