

And Resolved that upon the coming out the Lands in the said Pet<sup>n</sup> mentioned that for so much of the said Major Nicholas Sawalls Lands as is included within the Indians bounds this House at the next Sessions will take it into their Considerations to make such Compensation as shall be then thought reasonable.

Edward Wright according to the Warrant ag<sup>t</sup> him returns the writ of Election and Indentures whereon W. James Earle was Elected and on his Del<sup>y</sup> is Excused paying to the Clerg<sup>y</sup> and fifty five shillings, to the Clerk ten shillings and five shillings to the Door Keeper - The Petition of Hugh Matthews praying that a Bill may be brought in for the sale of Dennis Sulewants Land was read and referred till next sess<sup>n</sup>.

Bill for relief of Charles Rivers read the first time and the question put whether the same be read a second time or not carried in the negative by the majority of votes.

Petition for relief of Robert Morris and Robert Lewis read and referred - The House adjourns till to Morrow Morning Eight o'clock.

Tuesday July the 25-1721 The House meet according to adj<sup>y</sup>. Yesterdays proceedings read, the petition of Henry Hooper and the petition of John Seager praying relief on the act for ascertaining the bounds of Land<sup>s</sup> was read and referred till next Sessions,

The Petition of Thomas Hicks and John Rides praying they may be restored to the Poss<sup>n</sup> of Lands formerly given to the Indians but since by them deserted was read and referred till next Sessions, and Ordered the Indians concerned have notice to attend next Sessions if they think fit with their Interpreter - Col<sup>o</sup> Mackale from the Committee of Elections returns the following Report viz<sup>t</sup>

The Petition of Mehemiah and Anthony Secompt and Kath<sup>o</sup> Buff was read and referred till next Sessions and Ordered that the heirs of Garratt Clansloewagen have notice thereof - On reading the fourth paragraph of the Report concerning the Tobacco Trade the Question was put whether a time of limiting the planting Tobacco, shall be or not, Carried in the Affirmative by the Majority of votes, Then the question was put to what time, Carried by the Majority of votes that it be to the last of June, and Resolved further that
