to be set upon the State House for which he is to be allowed  
by the publick - Mr Evan Jones has the Liberty of  
Printing the Tobacco Law - Call Elphinstone from the Upper  
House Delivers Mr Speaks the following Message viz

dwell (and Mr Willmore members of your House and have
