7<sup>th</sup> All misdemeanors w<sup>ch</sup> shall happen within this house shall be censured and fined in the house

8<sup>th</sup> When any Bill is presented and no member makes objections thereto the speaker shall appoint any one member to speak thereat and deliver his opinion first

9<sup>th</sup> That no bill shall be read at any time during this session till all the members in town appear in the house and all committees be first called in

10<sup>th</sup> That no member of this house presume to smoke any Tobacco w<sup>th</sup> in the bar or gallerys of this house upon pain of being fined and censured at the discretion of the speaker not exceeding five shillings for any one offence
