It is reported to this Committee as an grievance that the petty
Jurors, are obliged to attend the Provincial Court, many of them
being summoned out of the remote part of this Province and obliged
to attend during the sitting of the Court and allowed but thirty
pounds of Tobacco for every day they attend the Court and have no
servant charges allowed the which is thought a great hardship
therefore it is referred to the House for their further consideration

Signed for Order in the Upper House
The House adjourns till to morrow morning nine of the clock

Wednesday October the 24th 1722, the House met according to
adjournment — Yesterdays Proceedings are read and reading
the report of the Committee of Grievances about Jurors allowances
Resolved the Jurors be allowed for their Stew Charges and Attendance
in the same manner as allowances of Evidences, summoned to attend
the provincial Court and to be paid by the publick and that a bill
be prepared for that purpose;
