 es as to the Election of Mr Humphreys for the City of Amherst
 Resolved that this House will not make a president of Mr.
 Humphreys, but that for the future, any person chosen to
 serve as a Delegate or Burgess that shall after such Election
 accept of any Office or pension from or under the Government
 shall (according to the practice of the British Parliament) be incap-
 able to sit or serve as a member in this House by Virtue of such
 Election
