On the motion of Thomas Bordley Esq. that something may be done on the petⁿ. of him the said Bordley and Thomas Larkin sent referred how best to be done the further consideration thereof is referred till next Session. Call Elphinstone with two others from the lower house Delivers Mr Speaker the Bill for the better relief of Poor Debtors. thus Endorsed

By the Lower House of Assembly Oct the 30th 1722 Read and will pass. Signed p^r order of the House Philip Skelton which was read again and pass for Engrossing. James P. Borel Esq from the lower House, Delivers Mr Speaker the Supplementary bill to the Act for repairing the publick records thus Endorsed

By the lower House of Assembly Oct the 30th 1722 the Com^{rs} being empowered by the former Law to agree with proper persons, to repair the records in Tobacco only and the price of Tobacco being uncertain and the place of payment precarious no one would agree with them for that consideration but at Exorbitant rates which is the true reason that the records are not yet repaired Therefore we propose to your House that a clause be added to the bill empowering the Com^{rs}. to agree with proper persons, either in money or Tobacco with which a donation the bill will pass.

Signed p^r order of the House Philip Skelton Thereupon the Bill is Committed for amendment which is accordingly amended and pass for Engrossing. On reading the Supplementary Bill to the Act to prevent making Maskey Tobacco the question was put whether a time for Planting shall be limited or not. Carried in the negative. then the question was put, whether the Fee on bad Tobacco should be pound for pound or two hundred pounds of Tob^o for 100. Resolved that it be two hundred pounds of Tobacco, p^r 100. when presented the being read the first and second
