 of the Affairs of the Indians. Lands. till next Sepcion but last. Any
 body should be surprized, by purchasing or leasing any Lands
 from them in that Intention propose the Ordinance hereunto sent
 as an Experiment thereof, Signed order. At Geneva the 10th of Nov. 1722
 they return and say they Delivered it - Call read from the
 upper House. Delivers Mr Speaker, the Bill to prevent the
 clandestine running of Tob^o. into the neighbouring Colonies
 thus. En doth Viz. By the upper House of Assembly Nov. 8th 1722
 this Bill being read. till pass. with the following Amendments
 Viz. 1st that Liberty be given to any person to seize Tobacco.
 2^d that any penalty be laid on all persons who shall resist or convey
 away the goods seized. Signed order. Then stepped the leg. Nov
 whereupon the bill is amended accordingly and pass for Enacting
 The following Message sent to the upper House by Mr. Viz. and
 Mr Humphreys Viz. by the Lower House of Assembly Nov. the 1st 1722
 it please your Honours. In answer to your Message of
 the 25th Octob. And a motion of this day as to the Shawan Indians
 this House Desires that His Honour the Governour. And the Council
 will be pleased to allow them such Gratuities of the taking up
 such runaway negroes. or slaves. as they shall think meet and
 that your Honours, will be pleased, to recommend the same to His
 Honour the Governour. Signed order. At Geneva the 10th of Nov
 they return and say they Delivered it - A Bill for the relief of Land
 poor prisoners, was read the first and second times by Special
 order and pass which was so Enacted and sent to the upper House
 by Mr. Maughop. and Mr Sherwood. they return and say they
 Delivered it - Brought into the House by Coll Waller
 the report of the Conference, on the money now in the Treasurers
 hands, for the use of Shaw Schools, which is as follows. Viz
 By a Conference held at the House, of Mr. Mersedy Nov. the 1st
 1722. to consider proper measures, for disposing the money raised
 for erecting Schools, in the several Counties the Conference, are
 from the upper House. The Honble Coll Matthew Delphman
