

- Mr. Robert King upon mature Consideration the Conference Report
and it is their Opinion. —
- 1^o. That an School be Erected at some convenient place in
Every County. —
 - 2^o. That there be seven persons Appointed by act of Assembly for
Every County as Visitors of the School of that County, whereof
the Major part to be Enabled to act and in Case of Death or
Absence to perpetuate their Succession in the same manner as
is provided for the Free School of Annapolis and if they be a body Politick
3^o. That such Visitors purchase some convenient parcell of Land
for the use of such School to containe one hundred Acres of Land
or there abouts and that as near as they can. And half thereof may
be fit for a private pasture and Cornfields and the rest for woodland
and for keeping the Yards in repair and feeding Firewood but
that none of that wood reserved for wood be hewed by any
Master otherwise than for the use of and unless by Consent of
the Visitors nor any Master be suffered to make Tobacco thereon
4^o. That in Case such Land have not a convenient House for a
School. Master to live and teach school in that the Visitors
provide such House, but that Especiall care be taken that such
Innentment be made for them as such place in each County as
may be most convenient for the boarding of Children —
 - 5^o. That the Visitors take proper Methods to Encourage good Schoolmasters
Capable of teaching Grammer. and the Mathematick is such
can conveniently be got and that they allow such Masters
Twenty pds. p aye for the present and take such other measures
as make such other Agreement from time to time for the future as
may give Due Encouragement to a Master and be useful for the
perpetuating such Schools. —
 - 6^o. That the Visitors meet at such School at least four times in the
year to inspect into and consider the Affairs thereof —
 - 7^o. That such Visitors draw on the publick Treasury for the sum
expended in such Treasures. Yards. the Master and the like to Answer
their Draughts according to their proportion and that the Visitors
be Empowered to Dispose of the said Money from time to time as
shall be most for the Advancement of such Schools. —
 - 8^o. That the Visitors keep their Accounts of their Disbursements and
all other Proceedings and be Subject to an Examination of the General
Assembly for any Mischarge Expenditure ^{or} Tobacco fine for Delay
or refusal to execute such Trust and likewise to take the last
and the like for the Executing their Office as taken by the Visitors
of Annapolis School. —
