We have appointed Mr. Samuel Hanson, Mr. Key, Mr. Jennings, and Mr. Knight, Members of our House, a Committee to inspect the Publick Records, lately transcribed at the Expence of the Country. Which we acquaint your Honours with, that you may, if you think it proper, appoint some of your House to join with them.

This Message was sent by Mr. Samuel Hanson, and Mr. Jennings; who return, and acquaint the House with their Delivery of it.

The Petition of St. Paul's Parish, in Queen Anne's County, recommended here from the Upper-House, was read: And Order'd, That Leave be given to bring in a Bill to confirm the Division formerly made by Commissioners.

The Petition of Peter Bromfield, a languishing Prisoner of Prince George's County, being Read, is Order'd, That Leave be given to bring in a Bill for his Relief.
