THE House met this Day according to Adjournment; the Members were call'd over, and all present as Yesterday, except Mr. George Robins. Yesterday's Proceedings were Read.

Benjamin Tasker, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers to Mr. Speaker the Petition of the Vestry, Church-Wardens, and Inhabitants of Durham Parish, in Charles County, thus Endors'd, viz.

By the Upper House of Assembly, October 11. 1728. Read and referr'd to the Consideration of the Lower House of Assembly: The Representation of the Justices of Prince George's County, concerning the Act relating to Servants and Slaves, being read, is referr'd to the Committee of Laws, to prepare a Bill to redress the Aggrievance therein reprefented.

Mr. James Donaldson was heard at the Bar of this House, by Mr. Williams Cumming, his Attorney, on his Petition, praying Leave to bring in a Bill to vest him with an Inheritance in Fee-simple, of and in a Piece of Ground, lying in the City of Annapolis, formerly laid out for a Custom House; and took the Clients Oath prescrib'd by Law.

Mr. William Hemsly applying to this House to go home on some extraordinary Occasion, the same was granted.

The Report of the Committee of Aggrievances, concerning Col. Thomas Cockey's Petition, being read, the House concur therewith.

The Petition of Mary Jenifer, praying an Allowance for so much as her deceas'd Husband was entituled to, being read, is referr'd to the Committee of Accounts, to make the Allowance as pray'd for.

The Petition of the Inhabitants and Freemen of Kent County, in relation to the Election of Capt. Ebenezer Blackistone, read, and referr'd to the Committee of Elections and Priviledges

Adjourn'd 'till to Morrow Morning 9 a Clock.
