For *Queen Ann's* County, Mr. *Augustine Thomson*, Capt. *William Elliott*, Mr. *William Hamsley*, and Major *William Turbit*, we find duly Elected.

For *Talbot* County, *James Holliday*, Esq; Mr. *George Robins*, Mr. *Samuel Chamberlain*, and Mr. *John Edmundson*, we find duly Elected.

For *Somerset* County, Major *Robert King*, Lieut. Col. *Levin Gale*, Capt. *George Dabiel*, and *William Stoughton*, Esq; we find duly Elected.

For *Dorchester* County, Mr. *John Brannock*, Mr. *Peter Taylor*, and Mr. *John Kirke*, we find duly Elected : But the Sheriff hath not complied with the Duty of his Office, in making Return of the Writ of Election according to the Tenor thereof : And we having received a Petition from sundry the Inhabitants of *Dorchester* County, complaining of the undue Election of Col. *William Ennalls*, a Delegate returned for the said County ; and having examined the sundry Evidences to us produced relating thereto, and maturely consider'd the same, do find that the said Col. *William Ennalls* is not duly Elected ; and that the said Sheriff hath been partial and remiss in his Duty, with respect thereto. All which we humbly refer to the Consideration of the House.

Which being read, the House unanimously concur with the said Report. Thereupon the said Col. *William Ennalls* is acquainted by Mr. *Speaker*, that he is not any longer a Member of this House, and is discharg'd from further Attendance.

Order'd, That Warrant issue to the Secretary, to prepare a new Writ of Election, to the Sheriff of *Dorchester* County, to Elect a new Member, in the stead of Col. *William Ennalls* ; who, for his undue Election, is dismissed this House.

Mr. *Isaac* and Mr. *John Nicholls*, take the Clients Oath, in relation to the Petition of *Vincent Lowe*, and *Elizabeth* his Wife, which they appear to, as Defendants.

Mr. *Richard Bell* qualifies himself at the Bar of this House, as an Attorney, by taking the Oath prescribed by Law.

Order'd, That the Petition of *Vincent Lowe*, be heard at the Bar of this House on *Tuesday* next come Seven-Night.
