# Notes and Resolves,

OF THE

## Lower House of Assembly, of the Province of MARYLAND.

(Die Mercurij, Octobris 16, 1728.)

THE House met this Day according to Adjournment; the Members were call'd over, and all present as Yesterday, except Mr. Stoughton, and Mr. Warfield. The Proceedings of Yesterday, were Read.

Col. Tilghman, and Charles Calvert, Esq; from the Upper House, deliver to Mr. Speaker the following Message, viz.

By the Upper House of Assembly, October, 16, 1728.

Gentlemen,

In Answer to your Message Yesterday, by James Harris, Esq; and Three more, this House have appointed Col. Matthew Tilghman Ward, Col. Richard Tilghman, and Charles Calvert, Esq; Members of this House, to join Mr. Harris, Mr. Dulany, Mr. Perrie, Mr. King, Mr. Samuel Hanson, and Mr. Beale, Members appointed by your House, in Conference, relating to the Subject Matter of the said Message; who will be ready to attend immediately.

Mr. Crabb, James Holliday, Esq; and Mr. Joshua George, are appointed a Committee to examine into the several Petitions relating to the better Support of the Rector of William and Mary Parish, in Charles County.

The House having taken into their Consideration, the Report from the Committee of Aggrievances, in Relation to the Act for the Establishment of Religious Worship, unanimously concur therewith.

By the Lower House of Assembly, October 16: 1728.

Forasmuch as we of the Committee, find it impracticable, at present, to regulate the several Parishes in Charles and St. Mary's Counties; and that we are of Opinion, there will be shortly a Necessity for the same: And the Rector of William and Mary Parish, in Charles County, having but a small Support, We think it reasonable, that 6000 Pounds of Tobacco be Yearly paid to the Rector of the said William and Mary Parish, for the Time being, by the Sheriff of Charles County; which 6000 Pounds of Tobacco is to be deducted
