And that the Sheriff of *St. Mary's County*, shall yearly pay to the Rector of *King and Queen Parish*, in *St. Mary's County*, 3000 Pounds of Tobacco, out of the Forty *per Poll*, arising due from the Inhabitants of *William and Mary Parish*, in *St. Mary's County*: All which, we humbly refer to the Consideration of the House.

Which Report being read, the House concur therewith.

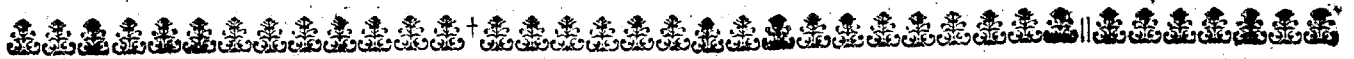

The Petition of *William Rayman*, of the City of *Annapolis*, praying leave to bring in a Bill, for his Naturalization, Read and Granted, on his taking the several Oaths to the Government, required by Law.
