

# Notes and Resolves,

Lower House of Assembly of the Province of  
*M A R T L A N D.*

( *Thursday, July 24, 1729.* )

THE House met according to Adjournment. The Members were call'd, and all present as Yesterday. The Proceedings of Yesterday were read over.

On reading the Petition of the Vestry and Freeholders of the Parish of *St. Luke* in *Queen Anne's* County, the following Question was put, *viz.* Whether *St. Paul's* Parish, in *Queen Anne's* County, should contribute to the Charge of building a Church in *St. Luke's* Parish, or not? *Resolved* in the Affirmative.

*Order'd*, That all the Parishioners of *St. Paul's* Parish, in *Queen Anne's* County, be taxed Ten *per* Poll, to be raised in the next Levy, and Ten *per* Poll the Year next after, to defray the Charge of building a Church in *St. Luke's* Parish, in the said County; and that the Parishioners of *St. Luke's* Parish be taxed with Ten *per* Poll yearly, until they have raised Tobacco sufficient to compleat the said Church.

*Order'd*, That *James Hollyday*, Esq; and *Mr. Thompson*, do prepare a Bill accordingly.

*Mr. Bartholomew Ennalls*, takes the *Client's Oath*, prescribed by Act of Assembly, at the Bar of this House, to a Petition preferred against him, by *William Dorrington*, of *Dorchester* County.

The Petition of *William Dorrington*, of *Dorchester* County, a Minor, preferred by *Mr. John Brannock*, his Guardian, coming on to be heard at the Bar of this House, *Col. William Ennalls*, a Member of this House, and Relation to *Mr. Bartholomew Ennalls*, (complained of in the said Petition) withdrew himself.

This House having weighed, as well the Allegations in the said Petition contained, urged by *Mr. Brannock*, Guardian to the Petitioner, as the Defence made by *Mr. Beckingham*, Council for *Mr. Bartholomew Ennalls*, do unanimously reject the said Petition.
