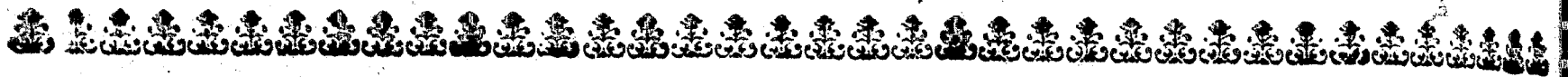

**T**H E House met according to Adjournment. The Members were call'd, and all present as Yesterday. The Proceedings of Yesterday were read over.

*Edmund Fenings, Esq;* from the Committee of Laws, delivers to Mr. Speaker, a Bill, Intituled, *An Act for the further Assessment of Forty Thousand Pounds of Tobacco on the Inhabitants of St. Anne's Parish in Anne-Arundel County, towards enlarging and repairing the Church in the City of Annapolis, and building a Chapel of Ease in the said Parish, and for the Payment of a fourth Part of the Charge, by a publick Assessment on the whole Province, for the Enlargement and Reparation of the said Church :* Which said Bill was read the first and second Time, by an especial Order, and passed. And sent to the Upper House, by Mr. *Beal*, and Mr. *Warfield* ; who return, and say they delivered the same.

*James Harris, Esq;* from the Committee of Laws, delivers to Mr. Speaker, a Bill, Intituled, *An Act impowering and directing the Justices of the several Counties within this Province, to levy any Quantity of Tobacco, not exceeding Ten Pounds per Poll, on the Taxable Persons of any Parish in each of their respective Counties, on Application to them made by the Vestry and Churchwardens of any Parish.* Which Bill was read the first Time, and order'd to lie on the Table.

*John Hall, Esq;* from the Upper House, delivers to Mr. Speaker, the Bill, Intituled, *An Act to confirm a Deed of Bargain and Sale from Stephen Yoakley, to Thomas Colmore.* Indors'd thus :
