May it please your Honours, This House having taken into their Consideration, the Amendments proposed by your Honours, * to the Bill, Intituled, A Supplementary Act to the Act for the laying out of Land, and erecting a Town in St. Mary's County, at a Place called Seymour Town, is of Opinion, that it is needless and unreasonable, that the Persons taking up any of the Lots, should be butthen'd with the paying of any Sum, especially as there is at present an Agreement between the Lord Proprietary, and the People of Maryland, concerning the Quit-Rents; and when that shall cease, his Lordship will be entitled to the Annual Sum mentioned in the Grant of that Land, according to the Teonour thereof; therefore defires your Honours to pass the Bill as it was first sent to your Honours, • by this Houle. '
