following Message. By the Upper House of Assembly 28<sup>th</sup> July 1731  
Gentlemen

The Commissioners appointed to receive the runaway Slaves  
taken up beyond Morocco and pay the value of such Slaves the sum of five  
pounds Current Money directed by Act of Assembly bearing off with what Money  
has been advanced for that purpose; and whereas M<sup>r</sup>. Sani an Inhabitant of  
those parts hath now brought in Runaway Slaves from beyond Morocco do propose  
that the said Person be immediately paid out of the publick Stock the sum of  
five pounds Current Money, and also that a further sum be ordered into such Commission  
hands as shall hereafter be appointed for the purposes in the said Act mentioned.

The following Message viz. By the Lower House of Assembly July 28<sup>th</sup> 1731  
May it Please your Honours

We agree with your Honours that M<sup>r</sup>. Sani should immediately receive the  
reward due by Law for taking up the Negroes mentioned in your Message and to  
that End have Ordered James Dudley Esq<sup>r</sup>. Treasurer of the Colonies here  
forthwith to pay it and Concur with your Honours that it is proper a sum of  
Money be Lodged in the hands of a fit person to prevent any Doubts to those  
who shall bring in Runaway Slaves taken upon the Coastward.
