The Committee choie John Rousby, Esq; Chairman; and appointed Thomas (lark, to be their Clerk.

Your Committee having confidered and examined the Papers laid before us, confifting only of Lists of Shipping, entered and cleared in Patuxent, from September 29, 1729, to September 29, 1730; and several Lists of Shipping entered and cleared in Oxford, from September 29, 1727, to September 29, 1728; containing Accounts of the Imports and Exports in both Places; and an Account of Imports and Exports into and from Annapolis, from August 26, 1729, to August 26, 1731; which are insufficient to enable us to give any certain or particular Information or Assistance to His Excellency the Governour, in giving Answers to the Queries mentioned in His Speech to both Houles, at the Beginning of this Session. And as your Committee apprehend, that giving true, perfect, and exact Answers to the said Queries, is of great Importance to the Country, so we conceive the best Measures ought to be taken, to be truly informed; which your Committee conceives to be a careful Examination of the Entries of all the several Naval Officers within this Province; which Entries cannot be had, during the Continuance of this Session. Therefore, your Committee conceive it would be proper, and propose, that both Houses join in an Application to His Excellency the Governour, to order the said Officers to lay the Copies of the said Entries, for such a Number of Years past as shall be thought proper, before the Committee to be appointed to lay the Publick Levy, or such of them as both Houses shall agree on; all which is submitted to the Consideration of both Houses, by your Committee.

On Reading the said Report, the House approve thereof; and appoint the Gentlemen of the Committee appointed by this House, to join with such Members as shall be appointed by the Upper House, to prepare an Address to the Governor, to obtain His Order to the several Officers, to lay Copies of their Entries before the Committee, when appointed. And Order'd, that it be an Instruction to the Members of this House, to give the Governor as good an Account as they can, of the State of the Trade of the Province.

On Reading the Amendments proposed by the Upper House, to the Bill, entituled, an Ast to make and emit Thirty Six Thousand Pounds Current Money, in Bills of Credit, &c. the House agree to make the several Amend-

ments; and Ordered the same to be done accordingly.
