AT a Session of Assembly, begun and held at the City of ANNAPOLIS, on Tuesday, the Eleventh Day of July, Anno Domini 1732; and in the Eighteenth Year of the Dominion of the Right Honourable CHARLES, Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon, Lord Baron of Baltimore, &c. appeared in the Lower House of Assembly, (His Excellency SAMUEL OGLE, Esq; being Governor,) the several Members following, viz.

For St. Mary's County. Capt. Thomas Waughop, Mr. John Read, Mr. Justinian Fourdon, Capt. Richard Hopewell.

For Kent County. Capt. Ebenezer Blackstone, Mr. George Wilson, Mr. Matthew Howard, Mr. Christopher Hall.

For Anne-Arundel County. John Beale, Esq; Daniel Dulany, Esq; Mr. Philip Hammond, Mr. Richard Warfield.

For Calvert County. Col. John Mackall, Mr. Benjamin Mackall, Mr. Walter Smith, Major Adderton Skinner.

For Charles County. Mr. John Courts, Mr. William Middleton, Col. Robert Hanson, Henry-Holland Hawkins.

Col. Tilghman, and Col. Ward, from the Upper House, and Mr. John Ross, Clerk of the Council, came into the Stadt-House; in whose Presence, the said Members of the Lower House took the Oaths of Allegiance, Abhorrence, and Abjuration, to His present Majesty King GEORGE the Second, repeated the Test, and sign'd the said Oaths and Test.

Soon afterwards, came John Hall, and John Rousby, Esqrs; from the Upper House, and inform'd the said Members, that the Governor required their immediate Attendance in the Council Chamber: Who thereupon went, and were requested by the Governor, to return to their House, and choose a Speaker. They returned to the Lower House, and chose Col. John Mackall, a Member returned to serve for Calvert County, to be their Speaker.
