Gentlemen,

By the Upper House of Assembly, 17 July, 1732.

On reading and considering the Bill sent up from your House, by Mr. *Beale*, and Twenty Four more, prescribing the Form of an Oath to be taken by the Judges and Magistrates in this Province, We find it much the same with that contained in the Bill pass'd last Session, by both Houses, for that Purpose, but refused by our late Governor: And as His Excellency, our present Governor, has been pleas'd to lay before this House, the Form of an Oath of Judge or Justice, sent from His Lordship, and likewise a Paper containing some Proposals for reconciling the Difference between His Lordship and the Country, upon this important Occasion; which, we are of Opinion, will be soonest and most effectually consider'd of, in a Conference between both Houses. If you concur therewith, be pleas'd to appoint some Members of your House, to join with some of the Members of our House, in a Conference for that Purpose.
