Your Committee are informed, that the Justices of Dorchester County Court have taken upon themselves to make a Rule of Court to justify their Clerk to tax the Sheriff's Fees on Executions in the Bills of Costs, and to include the Sheriff's Fee for levying such Executions in the Executions itself, as per Copy of the said Rule of Court, attested by the Clerk, with County Seal thereto affixed, appears: Which acting of the said Justices, your Committee takes to be very prejudicial to the Parties executed by such Executions; and are of Opinion, that the same is an Aggrievance. All which is humbly submitted, by your Committee, to the House, for their Consideration therein.

The Bill, intituled, An Act to impower the Inhabitants of Anne-Arundel and Prince George's County, to make a main Branch of the River Patuxent navigable, &c. Sent to the Upper House, by Mr. Beale, and Major Sprigg. They return, and acquaint Mr. Speaker, they delivered the same.

Mr. George, Mr. Cumming, and Mr. Hemsley, are ordered to prepare an Address to the Governor, concerning the Justices of Dorchester County.

Philemon Lloyd, Esq; from the Upper House, delivered to Mr. Speaker, the following Message.

In Answer to your Message of this Day, by Mr. Beale, and Five more, this House hath appointed Philemon Lloyd, Esq; Col. Matthew Tilghman Ward, and Michael Howard, Esq; Members of this House, to joyn Messieurs John Beale, Joshua George, Philip Hammond, William Hemsley, Ralph Crabb, and Walter Smith, Members appointed by your House, in the Conference by us proposed; who are ready to attend at the House of George Nelson immediately. The Question was put, That a Bill be brought in to emit Paper Currency? Resolv'd accordingly. Mr. George brought in an Address to the Governor, which was read and approved, and ordered to be ingross'd.

Capt. Hooper, from the Committee of Laws, delivered to Mr. Speaker, a Bill, intituled, An Act for laying an Imposition on Tobacco by the Hoghead for Support of Government, and for Payment of His Lordships Quit-Rents and Alienation Fines for the Time therein mentioned.

Which was read the first Time, and order'd to lie on the Table.

An Act to record and make valid in Law, a Deed of Bargain and Sale from William Winters, late of Queen Anne's County, to Richard Fisher, deceased.

Was read the first Time, and order'd to lie on the Table.

The Question put, Whether the Jurisdiction of County Justices shall be enlarged, in Recovery of small Debts? Carried in the Affirmative.

The Question put, If to Six Hundred Pounds of Tobacco, or more? Carried for Six Hundred Pounds of Tobacco.

Order'd, That Messieurs Joshua George, William Hemsley, and Robert Hanson, bring in a Bill accordingly.

Mr. Magruder, from the Committee of Laws, delivers Mr. Speaker, a Bill to ascertain the Gauge and Tare of Tobacco Hogheads; to prevent cropping, cutting, and defacing Tobacco taken on Board Ships or Vessels upon Freight; and to prevent false packing of Tobacco, and making Seconds.

Which was read the first Time, and order'd to lie on the Table.

Capt. Hooper, from the Committee of Laws, delivers Mr. Speaker, the Ingross'd Bill for the Tryal of all Matters of Fact in the several Counties where they have arisen, or shall arise, the Continuance of Causes in the Provincial Court, and Adjournment of that Court.
