Civility, importing some Jealousies and Diffirisfactions amongst the Connistog o Indians, occasioned by the Sertlements made by the Inhabitants of this Province, upon Lands on the Western Side of Susquebanmab River, near the Conniftogo Town, to which thole Indians pretend a Right; which Jealousies have been much augmentented by the Infinuations of some ill disposed Persons, Enemies to this Province: His Excellency therefore thought convenient to give the faid Captain Civility an Invitation hither, in order to remove any Suspicions he might have entertained, and cultivate a good Understanding for the future.

Pursuant to which Invitation, Captain Civility, Chief of the Connistogos, with Six other of those Indians, are now come down to this City; and as it has been heretofore customary, upon such Occasions, to make Presents; that being by Experience found the best expedient to keep up an amicable Correspondence with those People; whose Friendship (altho' not of themselves very considerable, yet as they are Dependants upon the Five Nations) may be of great Importance to Us: We therefore propose, that a Present, not exceeding the Value of Fisteen Pounds Current Money

be made to them, and desire the Concurrence of your House therein.
