We are very much concern'd, that your Honours have rejected the Bills for the Relief of several languishing Prisoners; because this House is very well informed, that they are real Objects of Charity : And to continue unfortunate Men in close Confinement, cannot produce the least Advantage to their Creditors, or any Body else; but may be the Loss of their Lives, and add to the Calamities of their poor Families. That these may be the Consequences of a long Consinement, we have several melancholly extant Instances. And we hope your Honours will so fail compasfion te the unhappy People, who now apply to the Legislature, as to agree to the Bill for enlarging such of them, as shall not appear to have been guilty of Fraud or Dishonesty. This we the more earnessly intreat your Honours to comply with, from a Sense of the Sufferings of our Fellow Creatures and Fellow Subjects, and to prevent the fad Consequences already mentioned.
