The following Message:

By the Lower House of Assembly, March 15, 1732.

May it please your Honours,

This House hath determined to take into their Consideration, the Regulation of the several Officers Fees within this Province; and, in Order to the Preparation of a Bill for that Purpose, propose a Conserence with Sign'd per Order, M. Macnemara, Cl. Lo. Fio.

Was sent to the Upper House, by Mr. Beale, and Mr. Hammond. Order'd, That the Committee of Laws prepare the Heads of a Paper Currency Bill.

Mr. Attorney, from the Upper House, delivered to Mr. Speaker, the Petitions of Jerome Plummer, Samuel M Cubbin, James Gibson, John Bradsbaw, Daniel Sullivan, and Isaac Tunney, languishing Priloners in Goal: And the following Message, viz. Gentlemen,

By the Upper House of Assembly, 15 March, 1732. Several People now in many of the Goals of this Province, having this Session, preserred to this House their Petitions herewith sent, praying a Bill may be brought in, to discharge and release them from their Confinements and Debts, upon Delivery of their Estates and Effects sor the Use of their Creditors; This House is sensible of many Inconveniencies arifing from such Petitions, and Bills thereon, every Sellion of Assembly, as well as the great Expence of the Country, on Occasion of the Time taken up in confidering such Petitions: Therefore this House proposes (if your House thinks proper) that a Bill may be sramed, agreeable to the Intention and Design of the Acts of Bankrupcy in England; which may relieve not only the Persons now in Goal, but also those who are or may be hereaster indebted, beyond their Abilities to satisfy: Such Provision, we think, will better answer the Relieving unfortunate Debtors, than the Method used by former Astemblies.
