

Mr. *Attorney*, from the Upper House, delivered to Mr. Speaker, the Bill, intituled, *An Act for the erecting a Town on the North Side of Sassafras River, &c.* indors'd:

Read a second Time; and will not pass.

An ingross'd Bill, intituled, *An Act to continue the Process and Proceedings in the Provincial Court, &c.* was read, and assented to; and sent, with the Paper Bill, to the Upper House, by Mr. *Crabb*, and Mr. *Allen*.

*John Rousby*, Esq; from the Upper House, delivered to Mr. Speaker, the Paper Bill, intituled, *An Act to continue the Process and Proceedings of the Provincial Court, &c.* indors'd:

The ingross'd Bill, whereof this is the Original, is read, and assented to.

A Bill, intituled, *An Act for the erecting a Town on the West Side of Great Choptank River, in Talbot County, for laying in Lots Thirty Acres of Land*, was read the first and second Time, by an especial Order, and passed; and sent to the Upper House, by Mr. *Goldsborough*, and Mr. *Needles*.

*John Hall*, and *Benjamin Tasker*, Esqrs. from the Upper House, acquaint Mr. Speaker, the Lord Proprietary desires his, and the rest of the House's Attendance in the Upper House, to see the ingross'd Bill, intituled, *An Act to continue the Process and Proceedings in the Provincial Court, and County Courts; and for Tryal of Capital Offences, at the next Provincial Court, to be held the Third Tuesday of May next*, passed into a Law.

Mr. Speaker, with the other Members of this House, went to the Upper House, where the Lord Proprietary, by the Clerk of the Council, declared His Assent to the Law.

The House adjourns until To-morrow Morning, Eight of the Clock.

Although this House could not recede from their Amendments proposed to the Bill, intituled, *An Act for Regulating of Ordinaries, and for the better Regulating of Ordinary-keepers and Innholders within this Province*; yet we should have made a more particular Answer to your Message of the 26th Instant, by Messieurs *Dashiels*, and *Middleton*, if the Rules of Parliamentary Proceedings could have been found by us, ever to have given Countenance to an Intercourse of Messages between the Two Houses, on Amendments proposed to a Bill; and therefore we have returned the said Bill to your House.
