Was sent to the Upper House, by Mr. Beale, and Major Sprigg.

An ingross'd Bill, intituled, *An Act Reviving and Continuing an Act of Assembly, intituled, An Act for the speedy Publication of the Laws; and for the Encouragement of William Parks, of the City of Annapolis, Printer,* was read, and assented to; and sent to the Upper House, with the Paper Bill, by Capt. Gordon, and Mr. Caldwell.

The House adjourns until To-morrow Morning, Eight of the Clock.

An ingross'd Bill, intituled, *A Supplementary Act to the Act for laying out anew Benedict-Leonard Town, &c.* was read, and assented to; and sent, with the Paper Bill, to the Upper House, by Col. Hanson, and Mr. Middleton.

Philip Lee, Esq; from the Upper House, delivered to Mr. Speaker, the Bill, intituled, *An Act for erecting a Town near Elk-Ridge Landing,* indors'd: Read a second Time; and will pass, if the Nomination of the Town be left to the Lord Proprietary.

Read here, and with the Amendment, passed for Ingrossing.

Benjamin Tasker, Esq; from the Upper House, delivered to Mr. Speaker, the Bill, intituled, *An Act for the Assessment of so much Tobacco on the Inhabitants of St. Stephen's Parish, in Cæcil County, as will build them a new Parish Church, and a Chapel of Ease, &c.* indors'd: Read the second Time; and will pass, with the Words *on or about,* in the 9th, 18th, and 26th Lines, being left out; and the Words *at or near,* put in the stead.

Read here, and with the Amendments, passed for Ingrossing.

The House adjourns until Two of the Clock in the Afternoon.

George Plater, Esq; from the Upper House, delivered to Mr. Speaker, the Bill, intituled, *An Act for erecting a Town near the Head of Monokin River, &c.* indors'd: Read the second Time; and the Words *One Brick Chimney* being inserted after *House,* in the 7th Line; and that the Lord Proprietary have the Nomination of the Town; will pass. Which Bill was read here, and with the Amendments, pass'd for Ingrossing.
